# NISIROS ISLAND

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Nisyros is one of the most beautiful Aegean Islands, yet untouched by tourism growth. According to Mythology, the island was created during the Gigantomachy, the battle between the Giants and the Gods. During that battle, Poseidon pursued the Giant Polyvotis to Kos, cut off a piece of the island and hurled it onto the Giant, thus sinking him into the Aegean Sea for eternity.

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The ragged, mountainous terrain of Tilos, its densely forested ranges, its hilly vistas, and its verdant valleys, are home to four hundred species of flowers and herbs and the habitat of rare species of birds such as Bonelli's eagles, hawks, nightingales, goldfinches, herons and bee-eaters.

# CHALKI ISLAND

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Chalki has been named after the copper (chalkos) mines that used to exist on the island. Chalki prospered in the late 19th century when the islanders became engaged in shipping and the sea sponge trade. Chalki shared the historical path of Rhodes and the island was integrated in the Greek state in 1948. The island distinguishes for its traditional architecture and the crystal beaches. As tourism is not much developed, it is a perfect destination for some peace and privacy.
